We kick off the New Year with our annual members' conference held in January.

The New Year's focus will be 'Inclusivity' with guest speakers and a fabulous venue where we can relax, chat and meet other members.

What does inclusivity mean to artists? It's a way of thinking that encompassing a set of principles and practices. It aims to ensure artists, regardless of backgrounds, identities, or perspectives, have the opportunity to participate fully and be recognised in the artistic community.

challenges, get the support and guidance they need to succeed.

Are you a puzzle piece, adding your own colours and shapes to the artistic landscape? Do you appreciate individual perspectives and celebrate what makes each artist special?

In a nutshell, inclusivity for artists is all about breaking down barriers, welcoming creativity from every corner, and creating a more diverse, fair, and vibrant art world. It's an ongoing journey towards making art a space where everyone's voice can be heard and valued.

Picture a gallery filled with art by people from all walks of life. Inclusivity in the arts is about celebrating everyone's unique experiences, cultures, and identities - a party that everyone's invited to. It means ensuring art spaces and resources are easy to get to and don't break the bank. It's about levelling the playing field.

Imagine being able to paint, sculpt, or perform without worrying about someone saying, "You can't do that." Inclusivity gives artists the freedom to explore, even if it challenges the status quo. It's making sure everyone gets a chance to shine.

Artists, regardless of where they come from, should have a fair

opportunity to be seen and heard.

Some artists are like social change warriors, using their creativity to fight for important causes. By speaking up through their art, the artist can make a difference.

Incorporating the thought process - thinking through the issues helps artists grow. It ensures aspiring artists, especially those facing

Victoria graduated from Liverpool John Moores in 2004 with a BA Hons in Fine Art specialising in sculpture, installation and performance.

She went on to work in the festival and carnival arts sector, producing work for the likes of Notting Hill Carnival, Thames Festival, Lovebox, Baisakhi Mela and Luton Carnival. There she developed a love of wearable sculpture and had private commissions for a number of industry professionals.

Whilst her work was always about community involvement, she felt that the carnival sector often embraced the use of synthetic materials. In 2009 Victoria began working with Watford Recycling Arts Project to develop a community practice that promoted the use of sustainable and recycled resources.

"As a child we were often struggling to make ends meet and my mother was incredibly resourceful and thrifty. Things were mended and reused and my art materials were leftover cereal boxes, fabric scraps and seed pods. I was taught to find the potential in everything. When I was seven, my mother took me to her homeland, Uruguay. For the first time my senses were fully enlivened by the rich farming heritage and vibrant culture there. My family lived on the coast.

It seemed like I was related to everyone, and they were all artisans, like me. Everything that was farmed or fished was used and nothing was wasted. It felt honest and harmonious.

"My work is the culmination of years of observation, study and delight in the natural world through the medium of weaving, a traditional practice in both the UK and Uruguay.

"My work always begins by playing. I find an object and fidget with it. What would happen if I put that there? Or turned it this way and that? If I try to control things too much, it doesn't work. Sometimes, when walking I imagine whole art installations and performances panning out in front of me but rather than being overcome, I start with a smaller object and begin to weave or sculpt. The physical touch grounds me.

"I know my style is unusual as most weavers start from the bottom up, but I like to work as if I'm painting; dotting around the image as if it's a three-dimensional canvas. I create, move on, return and overlay.

"Eventually the work tightens and knits together, as I weave in form and harmony. I have my own stock of carefully selected recycled fibres and threads I may juxtapose with new, natural, biodegradable fibres. I make my own beads from clay, twigs and recycled paper. The whole process is about full immersion in the activity - nothing is computer generated."


Ilf you enjoy chatting with other artists, a quick reminder that ALL area meetings are open to ANY Member from across the county giving you lots of places to meet other artists each month.




Jetchnsott CAMERA CLUB
